





## Although college enrollment rates continue to rise, gaps in enrollment rates and patterns persist across demographic groups.






# Financial Aid Mailing to Students

**You Can Afford College** 

Students receive a follow-up packet with valuable information about how to apply for financial aid and a checklist to help them complete the FAFSA and CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE applications. A list of free resources from the U.S. Department of Education and the College Board is also in the packet.



#### Apply for financial aid today. The average financial aid award in 2014-15 was \$14,210, with \$8,170 in grants that you don't have to pay back — FREE money. If you work at a job that pays \$10/hr., you'd have to work over 1.400 hours to earn that much, Instead, take one hour to fill To be eligible for federal student aid, you need to complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). To get started: 1. Create a Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID on fsaid.ed.gov. ↑ Time Estimate: 10–15 minutes An FSA ID is simply a login to Federal Student Aid sites, including the FAFSA, and can serve as your legal signature. Both you and your legal parent need to create an FSA ID to fill out the FAFSA online. 2. Gather information for the FAFSA. ☐ Social Security number (and your alien registration number, if you are an eligible noncitizen) □ 2015 federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned Records of 2015 untaxed income or benefits, such as housing, food, and other living allowances provided to members of the military, clergy, and others (if applicable) ☐ Most recent bank statements and records of investments (if applicable) 3. Set a date to complete the FAFSA. ☼ Time Estimate: 5 minutes Don't delay in submitting your FAFSA - some states and colleges award financial aid on a first-come, first-served basis. Expert Tip: Complete the FAFSA by the priority deadline for each school to avoid missing out on the maximum amount




